### 3-1-1 Houston Service Center



Happy Spring! Our Citizens on Patrol (CP) group reported 33.25 hours for February. Due to the Bugler deadline, I will have to report our patrol hours for March in May's newsletter. I can't believe that we have had another [homicide so close to our neighborhood](#)! I don't know if we will ever hear the whole story about what actually happened or if anyone will be held responsible for the homicide.

We have had a couple of men on bikes firing a gun while riding down Woodvine on March 7 around 4 p.m. HPD was called and they did patrol the area.

As always, don't become a victim to a crime of opportunity. It only takes a couple of minutes to check your doors, windows and gates to make sure they are closed and locked. We have heard about a couple of vacant homes being broken into and vandalized. We have a lot of things going on in our neighborhood, new construction, gated housing developments and a large apartment complex under construction.

As always, I want to thank our CP volunteers for patrolling our area whenever possible. I do believe we make a difference.

As always, be aware of your surroundings! Stay alert, be diligent and report any incidents that you see or hear. If the police department is not aware of anything going on in our neighborhood, they will not patrol our area. You can call the non-emergency number at 713-884-3131. # YARDS OF THE MONTH BEGIN IN BUGLER'S MAY EDITION

Yards of the month will begin appearing in the May issue of the Bugler, featuring the yards from April. The *Yard Hawk* will be driving through the neighborhood the last week of April to list all eligible yards for Yards of the Month. Following all the criteria really means a lot of work for the homeowner. Not every yard will have ALL the criteria; however, the obvious points can be met.

Below is Old Spring Branch's guide for getting your yard placed in the "Yards of the Month" list. *Save this for your future use.*

Criteria:	In addition:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Green, mowed and edged</li> <li>• General neatness (no visible garbage or clutter)</li> <li>• Shrubs and trees neatly pruned</li> <li>• Walks, driveways and curbs swept and clean</li> <li>• Nice overall landscaping design</li> <li>• Color contrast (flowers, shrubs, etc.)</li> <li>• City of Houston codes and OSB Deed Restrictions must be observed</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No dead plants</li> <li>• No out of season Christmas lights</li> <li>• Buildings, fences, porches and patios in good repair</li> <li>• Have no indoor furniture on porches or patios</li> <li>• Must be attractive and pleasing to the eye</li> </ul>

## HOMEOWNERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING DITCHES FREE OF DEBRIS

As a support for my always requesting that those who have ditches on their streets, be responsible for keeping them free of litter and debris, I am quoting the following City of Houston Code Ordinances [Article XI, Section 10-451 B(10)]:

“It is the abutting property owner’s responsibility to maintain ditches free of debris so water can flow with minimal obstructions (clear of weeds, brush, rubbish, of any debris that may prevent the flow of water). This means that it is your responsibility to maintain the ditch in front of your home.”

This applies to businesses also.

Amy Peck, our District A Council woman, is working on a new pilot “**Ditch Maintenance Program**” that will come in to help in a situation that it is not feasible for an owner to be responsible for the ditch in front of their home. **However, this new pilot program has limited funds and the homeowner must apply.** For information on the criteria to apply and how to apply, you can contact Amy Peck’s office at 832-393-3010

### YES! Put these in your recycling bin:

- **Metal and Cans:** Aluminum and Tin Cans. Examples include soup cans, vegetable cans, fruit cans, coffee cans (emptied and rinsed)
- **Cartons:** Both gable top and shelf-stable food and beverage cartons. Examples include milk cartons, juice cartons, soup cartons, soy milk/alternative milk cartons (emptied and rinsed)
- **Glass:** Bottles, jugs and jars only (emptied and rinsed)
- **Paper:** Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, office paper
- **Cardboard:** Cardboard and cereal boxes (emptied of packing materials and flattened)
- **Plastic:** Bottles, tubs and jugs #1 - 5 and 7. Examples include water and soda bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles. (emptied and rinsed)
